THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF TEMAGAMI

BY - LAW # 9®-268

BEING A BY-LAW RESPECTING SMOKING

WHEREAS section 104 of the Municipal Act R.S.O., Chapter 302 provides as follows:

"302. Every council may pass such by-laws and make such regulations for the health, safety, morality and welfare of the inhabitants of the municipality in matters not specifically provided for by this Act as may be deemed expedient and are not contrary to law."

AND WHEREAS paragraph 134 of subsection 1 of section 210 provides that by-laws may be passed by the councils of local municipalities;

"134 . For prohibiting and abating public nuisances".

AND WHEREAS it has been determined that secondhand tobacco smoke (exhaled smoke and smoke from idling cigarettes, cigars and pipes) is a public nuisance because of its irritating and discomforting properties and is a health hazard because of its impairment, adverse effect and risk to health, to the inhabitants of the Township of Temagami.

AND WHEREAS it is desirable for the health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the Township of Temagami to provide for regulating smoking and secondhand smoke for the better protection of persons from conditions injurious to health in accordance of this by-law;

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to provide for the prohibition and abatiang of secondhand smoke in accordance with the provisions of this by-law.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF TEMAGAMI HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. No person shall smoke in any area of the Temagami Welcome Centre.
- 2. Signs shall be conspicuously posted as to be clearly visible from all parts of the Temagami Welcome Centre.
- 3. Every person who contravenes this by-law is guilty of an offence and is liable to a fine of not more than \$500 exclusive of costs under the Provincial Offences Act.
