BEING A BY-LAW TO CLOSE AND STOP UP PART OF THE ORIGINAL ROAD  
ALLOWANCE ON FOURTH AVENUE IN THE TOWNSHIP OF TEMAGAMI  
-----

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient in the interest of/ the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Temagami, hereinafter called the Corporation, that a portion of the original road allowance set out and described in Schedule "A" attached hereto be closed and stopped up to vehicular traffic; /

AND WHEREAS notice of this By-Law has been published once a week for four successive weeks in the Temiskamirtg Speaker, a Newspaper circulated in the Township of Temagami; /

AND WHEREAS the Council for the said Corporation has heard in person or by his counsel, solicitor or agent, all persons claiming that their land will be prejudicially affected by this By-Law and who applied to be heard. /

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Twnship of Temagami enacts as follows: /

1. That upon and after the passing of this By-Law all that portion of the allowance for road set out and described in Schedule "A" attached hereto, be and the same /s hereby closed and stopped up.
2. All that part of the said unopened road allowance herein described and stopped up shall be open to pedestrian traffic.

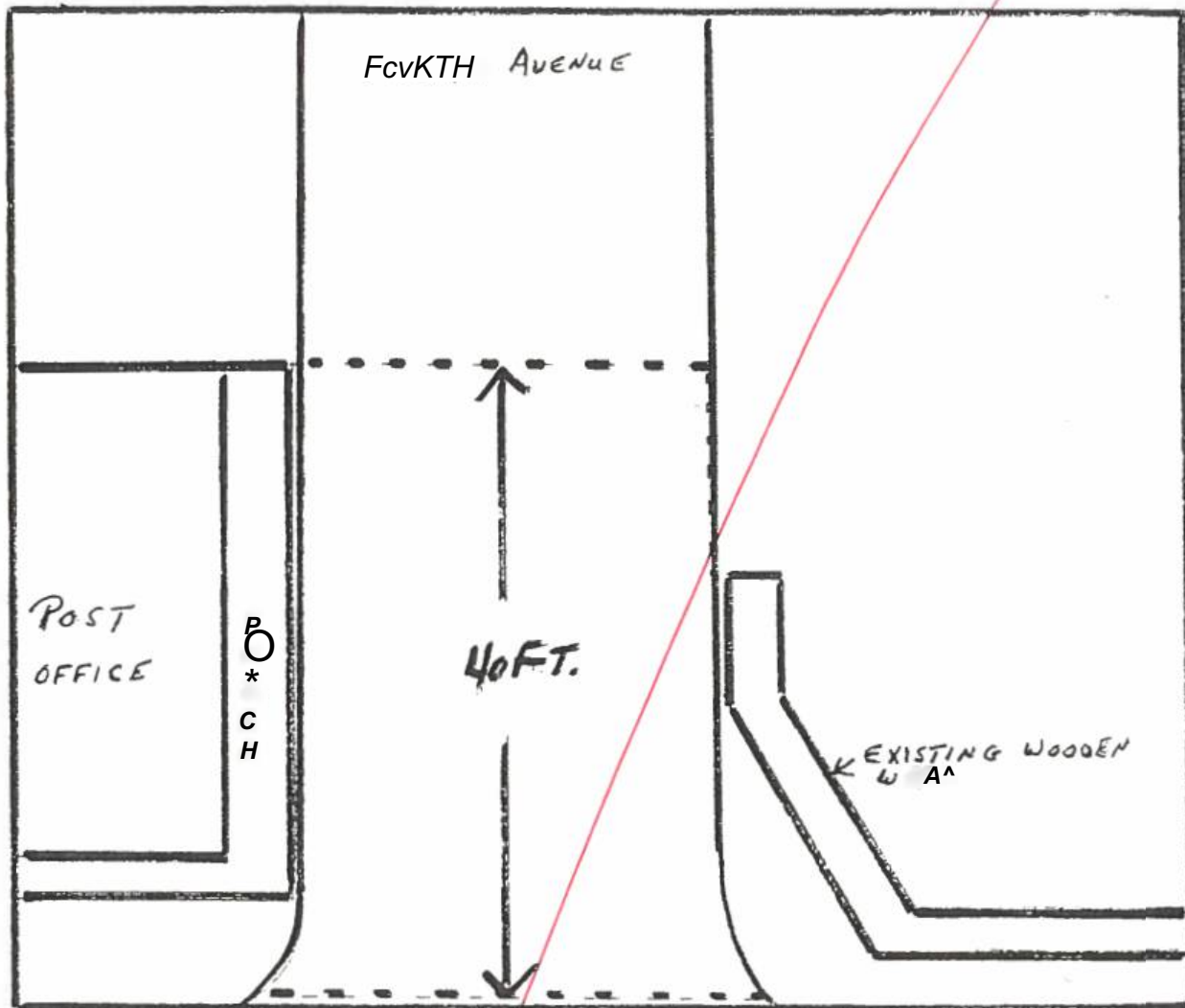

SCHEDULE "A" TO BY-LAW NO. 91- 274

Pursuant to the Municipal Act, RSO c.302 s.298(1)(c) & 298(10) the municipality proposes to close a portion of Fourth (4th) Ave. to vehicular traffic. The point of access and means of egress for this area will be located to the south of the Temagami Foodland property/.

Sec. 298(1)(c)...The Council of every municipality may pass by-laws,  
(c) for stopping up any highway or part of a highway...

Sec.298(10) ...The Council may in any by-law closing a highway provide  
that the same shall only be closed for vehicular traffic  
and not for pedestrian traffic, and may provide for the  
erection of barricades to enforce the due observance  
thereof.
